2008 ERIE CANALWAY PHOTO CONTEST WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Winning images to be featured in 2009 Erie Canalway calendar

WATERFORD, NY - The Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor today announced the winners of its 2008 Photo Contest. The twelve winning photographs and twelve honorable mention photographs will be featured in the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor 2009 Calendar. This year's contest drew 433 entries from 124 photographers, an increase of 145 images over 2007. A panel of judges selected winning photographs based on creativity, photographic quality, and effectiveness in conveying the beauty or character of the Erie Canalway in one of four contest categories: Historic Architecture and Engineering Marvels, For the Fun of It, Canal Culture, and The Nature of the Canal.

“The talent and enthusiasm of so many amateur and professional photographers that participate in the Erie Canalway photo contest each year never ceases to amaze me,” said Beth Sciumeca, Executive Director of the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor. “It’s truly an honor to be able to pick the best of the best of these stunning images that capture life along the Canalway and then share these photographs through our website and calendar with the broader community of residents, visitors, and admirers of the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor.”
